Friday, December 21 – 8 PM

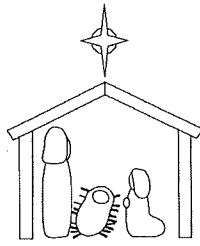

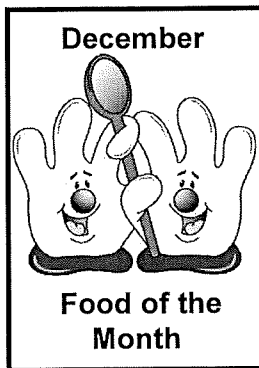
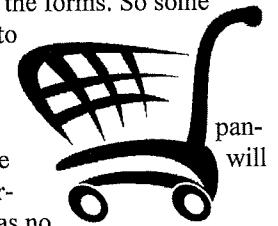


RESURRECTION'S FOOD PANTRY– December 2018

“Expressing Our Love of Jesus by Sharing God's Gift's With Other's”

It has been a busy month for the pantry. October is the month we begin re-registering all the clients and their families. It is also the time when we need to retrain the volunteers. We can also report that the south half of the building was painted on the inside and looks a great deal better. The new paint makes the flooring look really bad but I believe we will live with it until at least next spring.

When you look at the number of families served this past month, it looks low compared to the 190 family average we have seen for the last 6 months. It is low. We have found that clients don't like to register any more than we like to fill out the forms. So some of them put it off, maybe hoping they won't have to do it if they wait until November. However, they seem to be returning in November. During the first 2 weeks of November we had 135 families use the pantry. That will likely put us over 200 families for the month. October, and it looks like November as well, have been more challenging for the try financially. We have now spent more than we have taken in and it looks like we need to go in search of additional funding or will need to reduce the amount of purchased food we distribute. Looking at the pledge cards we used this year, there was no breakout for the planned support of the food pantry. So we are just going forward with complete trust in God to encourage people to support the pantry with everything we need. The spending plan for 2019 increased from \$7,200 to \$9,000 for the coming year. This new number reflects the additional food requirements for the 30% increase in clients we had during 2018. We just didn't see that increase coming last year when we put the plan together.



On a positive note: the people who work the distribution days of the pantry have been hearing that our clients appreciate the way they are treated. They say the staff treats them like real people and they feel respected and loved. There is really not much more we can hope for when we “Live and Share the Love of Christ”. The pantry requires a lot of resources to make it work. The funding, food, building and contents are important, but there is nothing as important as the people who make it go. When you contribute your time, prayers, funds, and food, to the pantry God is blessing those gifts to His purpose and showing that we do truly love our neighbors as He has loved us.

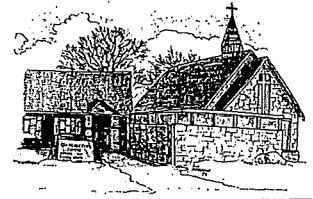
