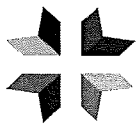

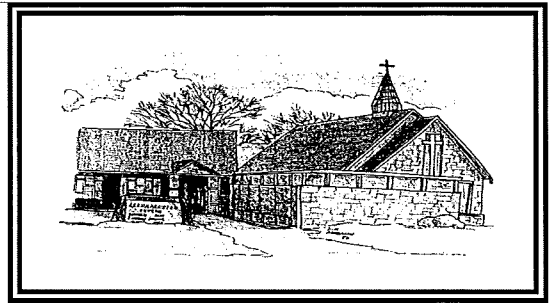

Green will rule again.

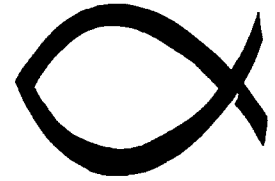

It was a shorter meeting..not much going on that needed attention. Financial stuff was kind of ok-we met expenses plus a couple bucks and that's good. No roof collapses from the snow-yet. No committee reports to consider other than a review of what's been happening recently and that mostly was about the Easter breakfast. It was really good to see the number of people that attended. GREAT JOB to all who made this happen. The council approved a request from the DarJune people to allow a dog to be on premises. It's a dog that will be trained and is expected to become a certified service dog. If you see a small kennel behind the house, that's why. There's a note on the bulletin board with this month's minutes explaining the whole thing.

RESURRECTION'S FOOD PANTRY

*"Expressing Our Love of
Jesus by Sharing God's Gift's With Others"*

April Food Pantry activity started with new urgency. Spring seems to bring renewed activity at the pantry as well as hoped for flowers. After a cold and icy winter, we are seeing an increased number of families using the pantry for at least the first 2 weeks of April. The first week we served 68 families, the second week we served 55. Considering we have been serving about 145 families in the entire month, we are at a pace which will likely bring in about 170 families for the month. That increase is significant. We are able to fill the bags for the additional people as needed. We do run out of canned pork and beans, soup, meals in a can, and meals in a box on a regular basis. We supplement the donated food with purchases from Aldis. We are looking forward to the "Stamp Out Hunger" food drive by the postal workers on May 12. In anticipation of that event, we have built 2 additional shelving units to hold the anticipated 3 to 4 totes of food that the pantry will receive. Help will be needed to sort and put away the food when it is delivered to the pantry in the early afternoon on the 12th. If you can help, it would be greatly appreciated. We continue to receive a significant amount of food from Ascension Lutheran and Incarnation Lutheran each month. We also use Feeding America for fresh fruits and vegetables, baked goods, canned vegetables, dairy products, cookies, condiments, cereals, coffee, and sometimes meat.

We are thankful for the many volunteers that help at the pantry. We could not perform this ministry without them. Here is the info for March 2018

- 3 infant • 274 total served

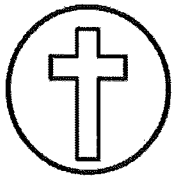

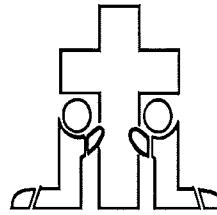

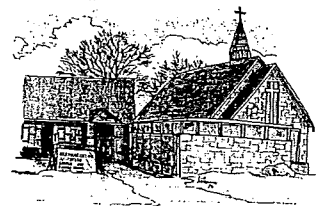
